Intent to Register (ITR)

Is the opportunity for students to notify Western of their academic preferences for the upcoming 2025-2026 academic year.

ITR is mandatory for first year students

Available on Student Centre from February 26th – April 2nd 2025

You can submit or revise your ITR choice until 11:59pm April 2nd 2025.

The last submission will be your official ITR choice.



Who Should Submit an ITR?

- Mandatory for first year, undeclared or transfer students.
- Upper year students who want to continue in their current module.
- Upper year students who want to make changes to a current module:
- Add or remove a module,
- Switch from a 3 to 4-year degree,
- Request entry into an honours module
- Change your status (full or part-time)
- Change your home faculty/campus

Why is it Important?

- Sociology Department Module students receive enrollment priority in many Sociology courses.
- Undeclared students will have to wait until late July to enrol in some Sociology courses. Courses may fill before the priority lifts.






Additional grades required



All degree options require students to complete 5.0 credits at the 1000 level to satisfy the first year requirement. The remaining credits are divided into module courses and electives based on module choice.


* ITR 2025 is the last opportunity for students to request entry into the Criminology Major.


Students can combine modules:

FAQ:

Q: Will a double major take longer to complete than a single major?

A: No. A 4 year degree is 20.0 credits, regardless of approved module combinations. The number of electives decreases as the number of module courses increase. A single major or double major are completed in the same amount of time and total credits.

Criminology Major

The Criminology Major admission will be discontinued effective September 1st 2026.

- Students will have the opportunity to request entry into the Criminology Major for the last time during ITR 2025 for the 2025/2026 academic year.
- The Sociology department will continue to offer a variety of <u>Power and Justice</u> courses required to fulfill the Criminology major module requirements.
- Students enrolled in the Criminology Major by September 2025 will be permitted to complete the module requirements and graduate with the degree. Module requirements must be completed no later than <u>August 31st 2030</u>.
- No new entry to the Criminology Major will be permitted after September 1st 2026.
 The Criminology Major will NOT be an option during ITR in March 2026 onward.

Admissions Requirement

Specialization, Major, Double Major, Minor

Completion of first-year requirements, including 60% in 1.0 credits of Sociology: Complete both:

- Sociology 1025A/B (0.5) and
- Sociology 1027A/B (0.5)
 OR
- The former Sociology 1020 (1.0),
- The former Sociology 1021E (1.0)
- The former Sociology 1026F/G (0.5) in combination with 1025A/B (0.5) or 1027A/B (0.5)

The 60% minimum applies to both 0.5 credit courses or 1.0 full year course

Admissions Requirement (Honours)

Honours Specialization, Honours Double Major

- 5.0 completed first-year credits (1000 level) with no fails.
- Minimum 70% average in 3.0 principal courses including:
- 1.0 Sociology 1000 level
- 2.0 credits of your highest grade 1000 level courses in any subject(s) (including additional module if applicable).

The final grade in each of the 3.0 principal courses must be 60% minimum with no failed courses in the most recent academic year.

Tips for Success

Choose a Module

- Request a module for which you are confident you meet the course and grade requirements for admission.
- Any module choice is better than remaining undeclared for course enrollment purposes.

Back Up Plan

- Provide a 2nd choice that is different from your 1st choice.
- If you think you might qualify for an Honours module, submit your
 1st choice for Honours (ex: Honours Double Major) and

2nd choice as a non-honours module (ex: Double Major)

Faculty of Social Science Bachelor of Arts (4 Year) Major in Sociology Major in Criminology



Tips for Success

Module Order Matters

Your diploma will list the module subjects (same level) in the order you select during ITR.

Ex 1: Psychology Major + Sociology Major

Ex 2: Sociology Major + Psychology Major

 Your home faculty is determined by your highest module or first major in a double Major combination.

Ex 1: Faculty of Social Science – Specialization in Sociology + English Major

Ex 2: Faculty of Social Science – Sociology Major + English Major

Ex 3: Faculty of Arts and Humanities – English Major + Sociology Major

Benefits of a Minor

 A minor will NOT appear on your diploma but will appear on your transcript. Students who add a minor to their degree (ex: Sociology Major + History Minor) will receive course enrollment priority for both subjects. Membership in a department module will often determine course enrollment eligibility and priority.

Change Your Mind?

- If you change your mind, ITR changes can be made online up until 11:59pm April 2nd.
- You will have the opportunity each year during ITR to make changes to your module or degree type. If you don't qualify for your preferred module choice this year, you can try again next year.



Submit Your ITR

Step 1 : Review

- Review the different modules offered by the Sociology Department. Module checklists outline the grade and course requirements to complete a module.
- Review the list of courses in each of the <u>4 areas of</u> <u>Sociology</u>.

Step 2: Clarify



Step 3: Submit

- Follow the <u>step-by-step guide</u> to submit your ITR request.
- Make changes on student center until 11:59pm on April 2nd.



Step 4: Placement

- May: Final grades are assessed and ITR requests are reviewed for eligibility.
- June: Check student Center to see which module you have been accepted into. Plan ahead by drafting your schedule in June.
- July-Sept: You will be assigned a course enrollment date based on year of study. For best results, enrol in Fall/Winter courses on your assigned enrollment date in July.
